Nevada State Medicaid Information

In Nevada, households with annual incomes of up to 138% of thefederal poverty levelmay qualify for Medicaid. This is \$16,753 per year for an individual, or \$34,638 per year for a family of four. Click the link above to find out how Medicaid may affect your students, clients and families
